
#### Language and Notes

#### Methodology: Design

- **1. Drew from The Carnegie Classification of Institutions 2015** to pull an Excel spreadsheet of all colleges and universities in the United States (*n*= 4,567)
- 2. Divided states into regions (per Carnegie Classification), with each team member assigned to colleges and universities in one or more regions
- 3. Created a Google Sheets spreadsheet featuring the following columns, inputting information related to the following points later:
  - 1. College name
  - 2. City
  - 3. State
  - 4. Institution type (private, public)
  - 5. Level (2-year, 4-year)
  - 6. Region

- Features a program for autistic college students (yes/no/unsure)
  Notes
- 3. Reviewer initials
- 4. Date collected

Note: Later we added columns to allow for interrater reliability (inputting the second reviewer who reviewed info, date modified, notes, and a program link )

Though 4,567 institutions were reviewed, many colleges and universities have since closed.

#### Methodology: Design (cont.)

- 4. Determined that we would use two keywords in tandem autism and program to search for the existence of programs specifically for autistic college students at these colleges and universities. We searched for these terms on the homepages of these college websites.
- 5. Reviewed colleges, occasionally meeting to discuss preliminary findings. During the search we were very intentional in determining that the college program featured messaging that indicated it exclusively catered to autistic college students (or primarily catered to them).
- 6. Engaged in a second review of colleges when complete (featuring different reviewers), paying particular attention to colleges marked as "unsure" (regarding having autism programs) and also tracking both false negatives and false positives.
- 7. Discussed lingering questions and concerns about programs to ensure we were on the same page about all included programs meeting criteria.
- 8. Sent emails to 5 colleges that were unclear in their messaging about *whom* they serve.
- 9. Translated information about college autism programs into this PDF.



#### Methodology: Inclusion Criteria

To be included in our list, the program had to meet these criteria:

- Centers on a college-offered *program* catered exclusively to (or primarily serving) autistic college students currently enrolled at a college or university; if unclear, we emailed the contact point representing the particular program
- Features a webpage about the program
- Currently active (e.g., not closed or under development)
